



## Political Science, Philosophy, and Economics Major (54 credit hours)

The Political Science, Philosophy, and Economics major is designed to transform students with an interest in or concern for politics into graduates who can understand, evaluate, manage, and shape political events and governmental actions in a manner consistent with a Christian faith perspective. The program involves the systematic study of how political institutions influence the behavior of citizens, leaders, and international actors to achieve public policies that promote justice both nationally and globally. Our program will help you prepare for successful careers in government, politics, law, non-profits, teaching, journalism, business, and more.

- POSC 2400, Political Science Research Methods, 3 credit hours (fulfills Writing Intensive)
- POSC 2420, Applied Statistics Lab, 1 credit hour
- MATH 2120, Introductory Statistics with Applications, 4 credit hours (fulfills Quantitative Reasoning)
- ECON 2010, Principles of Macroeconomics, 3 credit hours (fulfills Social and Behavioral Ways of Knowing)
- ECON 2020, Principles of Microeconomics, 3 credit hours
- PHIL 2000, Introduction to Philosophy, 3 credit hours
- PHIL 2120, Ethics, 3 credit hours

#### Advanced Courses (12 credit hours):

- POSC 3510, International Political Economy, 3 credit hours
- ECON 3410, Money, Banking, and Financial Markets, 3 credit hours
- PHIL/POSC/HIST 3010, History of Political Thought, 3 credit hours
- PHIL/RLGN 3250, Ethics and Morality for Professionals, 3 credit hours (fulfills Christian Ways of Knowing)

#### Electives (12 credit hours):

• Remaining hours are chosen from additional upper-division (3000-level or above) POSC, PHIL, or ECON courses not previously taken, or from BIBL 3420 or RLGN 3120.

No more than 3 credit hours from POSC 4800, 4810 and 4820 may be applied toward the major.
