

General information

Computers must have a network card. Computers purchased within the last two years most likely have a network card. More information about getting your computer ready for the AU campus will be mailed to you soon in the student newsletter. E-mail, voicemail, and campus mail are the primary means of communication among the campus community. Students are expected to check each of these at least weekly and are required to set up voicemail, even if they have a cell phone. Students will be held responsible for information, deadlines, etc., sent through campus mail, e-mail, and voicemail.

Curfew at AU is self-regulated. We encourage students to be responsible in their choices and come in at a reasonable hour. When the residence hall staff becomes aware that a student is not making positive choices in this area, a staff member will talk with the student. The residence halls are locked 24 hours a day, seven days a week with card access.

Open house hours are Tuesday and Thursday 6-10 p.m., Friday 5 p.m.-12 a.m., Saturday 1 p.m.-12 a.m., and Sunday 1-9 p.m. Room doors must remain at least halfway open when visitors of the opposite sex are in the room.

Quiet hours are generally 11 p.m.-9 a.m., though these may be extended by the agreement of hall or floor residents. All other times should be considered courtesy hours, during which residents are considerate of each other.

Martin Hall specifics

- > Room size: 12' x 17'
- > Ceiling height (except for basement): 9'-4"
- > Basement ceiling height: 7'-11"
- > Extra-long twin mattresses
- > Personal lofts are not permitted
- > Furniture is stackable and designed to be lofted or bunked
- > Only love-seat-sized couches will fit under lofted furniture
- > Room furniture is moveable
- > Room furniture is attached and nonmoveable except in basement rooms
- > Rooms are air-conditioned
- > Handicap-accessible first floor rooms, restroom, lobby, laundry, and kitchenette

What we provide

All of the residence hall rooms have vinyl flooring and are furnished with mini-blinds, twin beds, dressers, closets or wardrobes, desks, desk chairs, and desk lights. All of the furniture in the residence hall rooms must stay in the rooms. Storage is not available in the residence halls.

What to bring and what to leave at home

You should bring blankets, towels and linens (sheets and pillow cases) and your own pillow. You may wish to bring optional items such as a fan, stereo, bed-spread, area rug, iron, alarm clock, waste paper basket, small compact microwave oven, compact refrigerator (as large as 4.0 cu. ft.), and other items that will make your room seem like home. For safety purposes, hot plates, electric frying pans, any appliance with an open flame, appliances that do not shut off automatically, George Foreman-type grills, candles, and halogen lamps are not permitted. Dart boards are also not permitted in the residence halls. For the safety and security of all residents and to comply with safety codes, only extension cords with fused strips (power strips or surge protectors) may be used.
